## **CREWKERNE TOWN COUNCIL**

Minutes of the **ANNUAL TOWN MEETING OF ELECTORS** held in the Victoria Hall, Market Square, Crewkerne on Monday 15 April 2019 at 7.30 p.m.

The Town Crier, David Craner, announced the opening of the meeting with a special cry.

## 1. INTRODUCTION BY CLLR. MRS KATHY HEAD, THE MAYOR

The Mayor welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked them for attending. She said there would be an opportunity for electors to ask questions or to raise matters of concern following the presentations.

## 2. ANNUAL HONOURED CITIZENSHIP AWARD PRESENTATION

The Mayor presented an Award to Mr Richard Hall. Mr Hall was well known in Crewkerne as the energetic, generous and hard-working proprietor of Oscars wine bar. He supports many of Crewkerne's voluntary organisations and had bolstered many of the town's sporting, artistic, recreational and leisure events with his enthusiastic and lively input.

Mr Hall accepted the award and thanked everyone. He highlighted the fact that his mother and father had both worked tirelessly to support the town and he considered that he was accepting this award on their behalf.

The Mayor then presented an award to Mr Norman (Tim) Udall. Mr Udall had served not only on the Town Council but also given staunch support to the Twinning Committee as well as the Rotary Club. He was currently a trustee of the Henhayes Centre where his knowledge and calm appraisal of problems were proving invaluable.

Mr Udall accepted the award and thanked everyone, paying particular thanks to his family for their support. He recounted that the Victoria Hall held special memories for him, dating back to his time as a pupil in the local boys' school.

## 3. MAYOR'S COMMENDATION AWARD

The Mayor presented the Mayor's Commendation Award to Mr David Craner. The award was given in recognition of his dedicated service to the community of Crewkerne, as the Town Crier for Crewkerne for the last 12 years.

Mr Craner accepted the award and thanked everyone. He said that the highlights of his time as Town Crier were the Queen's visit and the fact he had been made Honorary Town Crier for Crewkerne's twin towns of Igny and Bures-sur-Yvette.

## 4. INTRODUCTION OF TOWN COUNCILLORS

The Mayor introduced the Councillors and thanked them for their support through the year. She paid particular thanks to the four Councillors who were not standing at the forthcoming elections: Cllrs. Mrs Rusty Jackson, Miss Katy Pritchard, Mrs Angie Singleton and Neil Sturtivant.

## 5. <u>TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE LAST ANNUAL TOWN MEETING</u> <u>ON MONDAY 16 APRIL 2018</u>

The Minutes of the meeting of the Annual Town Meeting of Electors held on Monday 16 April 2018 were **APPROVED**.

#### 6. MATTERS ARISING FROM THESE MINUTES

The Clerk reported that reducing one-use plastic and permit parking had both been raised at last year's meeting.

- <u>Reduction of one-use plastic</u>: the Clerk advised that the Deputy Clerk was investigating a number of initiatives around the theme of reducing one-use plastics. This was going to be a focus of attention at the forthcoming summer food festival. In addition, the Deputy Clerk was exploring potential grant funding to enable a water filling station to be installed in the Town Hall Local Information Centre.
- <u>Permit parking</u>: the Clerk reiterated the point made at last year's meeting, that permit parking schemes were managed, organised and run by Somerset County Council.

# 7. TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM THE POLICE

Constable Chris Purcell described the work of the local policing team, highlighting the fact that the priority was very much for the team to work within the community as much as possible, to ensure that the police presence was both visible and accessible.

## 8. <u>TO RECEIVE THE MAYOR'S ANNUAL REPORT OF CREWKERNE TOWN</u> <u>COUNCIL BY CLLR. MRS KATHY HEAD</u>

Cllr. Mrs Head gave a presentation which highlighted the key points in this year's Mayor's Annual Report, written copies of which were available at the meeting.

#### 9. <u>TO RECEIVE AN ANNUAL REPORT ON THE ACTIVE LIFESTYLE CENTRE AND</u> <u>CREWKERNE AQUA CENTRE FROM CLAIRE SAXBY, DIRECTOR OF</u> <u>CREWKERNE LEISURE MANAGEMENT</u>

The Mayor welcomed Mrs Claire Saxby, Chairman of Crewkerne Leisure Management (CLM) to the meeting.

Mrs Saxby reported that the last year had been challenging for CLM, with major expenditure both committed and planned, in order to maintain and enhance the facilities at the Aqua Centre. She emphasised that the team of loyal volunteers were key to the continuing success of the Aqua Centre but noted that, with great regret, Neil Sturtivant, the Aqua Centre Manager, had tended his resignation.

#### 10. TO RECEIVE AN ANNUAL REPORT ON THE GEORGE REYNOLDS CENTRE FROM CREWKERNE SPORTS AND YOUTH ACTIVITIES LTD (CSYAL)

The Mayor noted that Mr Carr, Director of Crewkerne Sports and Youth Activities Ltd. (CSYAL), had been unable to attend the meeting and that Mr Samuel of the Royal British Legion had kindly agreed to present a report to the meeting on behalf of CSYAL.

Mr Samuel reported that, for CSYAL, the year had been one of stability and gradual improvement in usage of the GRC. The staff and Directors had worked hard to support the running of the GRC throughout the year.

#### 11. <u>TO RECEIVE A PRESENTATION FROM ROSEMARY PRINCE, CHAIR OF</u> <u>TRUSTEES, ON THE HENHAYES CENTRE</u>

The Mayor welcomed Ms Rosemary Prince, Chair of Trustees, on the Henhayes Centre to the meeting.

Ms Prince thanked the Town Council for the grant towards the Henhayes Centre, which was needed to support their core services. She summarised the varied programme of activities undertaken at the Centre. She also explained that the Centre had been managed by the team of voluntary trustees but the decision had been taken to take on a manager for the Centre, whose focus would be on sourcing grant funding and in increasing usage of the Centre.

#### 12. <u>TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM SOUTH SOMERSET DISTRICT COUNCIL</u> (SSDC) REGARDING SSDC PRESENCE IN THE TOWN HALL FRONT OFFICE

The Mayor welcomed Ms Sharon Jones, Customer Focused Team Manager, South Somerset District Council (SSDC).

Ms Jones gave the meeting an informative presentation, explaining how SSDC's front-facing services were in the process of being transformed in a way which promoted self service solutions to customer need

## 13. <u>TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM THE CREWKERNE BRANCH OF THE ROYAL</u> <u>BRITISH LEGION</u>

The Mayor welcomed Mr Tony (Sam) Samuel and Mrs Alice Samuel, of the Crewkerne Branch of the Royal British Legion (RBL).

Mr and Mrs Samuel described the work of the Legion and the many events organised over the last year by the Crewkerne Branch, which had gone from strength to strength over the last few years. They thanked Mrs Sarah Wills, the GRC Manager, for making them so welcome at the GRC.
