Crewkerne Voluntary Transport is a registered charity run wholly by volunteers and has been helping provide transport for people in Crewkerne and the surrounding villages for 50 years. There are 2 mini buses, a 16 seater and an 11 seater, both with disabled access, which can be booked by any community group or organisation for long or short journeys, shopping trips or days out.

Annual Open Day at Townsend Cemetery

Sunday 16 September, 1 - 4 pm Organised by the Crewkerne & West Crewkerne Joint Burial Committee



Please join us for the open day and look around the chapel and the beautiful and tranquil grounds of the cemetery, which was established in 1874.

This year there will be two talks. At 2.30 pm, the Clerk will give a talk illustrating how the burial records reveal how life has changed since the Victorian days when the cemetery first opened. This will be followed by a talk and guided tour by Tracey Warren, a local funeral director, where she will point out some of the notable graves in the cemetery and how they give an insight into Crewkerne's social history.

As always, the historic burial registers will be available for inspection and the Clerk will be on hand to assist visitors if they wish to undertake some family history research.

Townsend Cemetery Maintenance

In conjunction with West Crewkerne Parish Council, the Town Council maintains the Townsend Cemetery grounds and chapel. This is a fine example of a Victorian cemetery, but inevitably there is a great deal of work involved in maintaining both the buildings and the grounds. Recent visitors will notice that the main driveway into the cemetery, which was in a very poor state, has now been completely resurfaced and the opportunity taken to create a small amount of additional parking for vehicles (something which the Victorians did not need to worry about!).



You may have noticed that a new disabled-friendly picnic bench has been installed at Bincombe Beeches. The Town Council would like to thank the Crewkerne Action for Disabled (CAD) community group for their generous donation, which enabled this bench to be purchased.



As this newsletter was going to press, work was about to commence on the installation of a disabled-friendly swing in the Henhayes playground. Once again, the Council would like to thank CAD for their generous donation which has allowed this piece of play equipment to be purchased.
