Boost for Local Businesses

South Somerset District Council (SSDC) has provided £14,000 of grant funding to support Crewkerne's local business community as they recover from the pandemic.

SSDC has now authorised the Town Council to work with the business community to find ways to best utilise this funding. Leighton Ballantine, a local businessman in Crewkerne and a member of Crewkerne's local business group, said "this funding gives us an excellent opportunity to undertake initiatives to encourage more people into the town and boost local businesses, such as a campaign to market the town and holding events in the town centre".

Return of Face-to-Face Council Meetings



With the lifting of covid restrictions, the Town Council has agreed to re-commence face-to-face Council meetings at the Town Hall Council Chamber, as from September. But the Council also recognises that YouTube live streaming is an excellent way to enable many more people to have visibility of ongoing Council business, so the aim will be to combine face-to-face meetings with simultaneous live streaming.

You may have noticed that the Speed Indicator Device (SID) has been deployed in various locations around the town. It is already clear that the SID is being effective in acting as a deterrent to speeding motorists.



We have approval from Highways to locate the SID on the following roads: North Street, Station Road, Chard Road, Ashlands Road, East Street, Hermitage Street and Mount Pleasant, and we are working on gaining approval for a new post so that we can also deploy the SID in Broadshard.



The SID is a useful tool to help deter speeding motorists, but in the past the Community Speedwatch was also very effective. We are keen to get Community Speedwatch up and running again, but for that we need volunteers. ENVIRONMENT INITIATIVES

Cllr. Alice Samuel, one of our new Councillors, has a passion for the environment and has already put forward a number of ideas to the Council for environmental initiatives. Cllr. Samuel said "there are many ways that the Town Council can assist in promoting and supporting a cleaner, greener, Crewkerne". These are some of the proposals either already underway or in the pipeline:

Air Quality Monitoring



The Council has received a number of complaints about poor air quality in the town centre, perhaps not surprising when you consider the volume of traffic passing through the town. With the aid of SSDC grant funding, the Council is to install an air quality monitoring station in the town centre. This will allow us to measure air quality levels and, if it comes to seeking support from bodies like the Environment Agency, then having measured data to support our case will be key.

Encouraging Biodiversity

The Council owns a number of large open spaces. Traditionally these are cut as short grass, but this summer you will have noticed that clearly defined areas at Bincombe nature reserve, Barn Street recreation ground, the unused area of the cemetery and the grassed area surrounding the tennis courts at Severalls, have been allowed to grow as meadow grass. The result has been a boon to wildlife: wildflowers, butterflies, bees and crickets have all thrived in these areas.



Engaging with Young People

Cllr. Samuel said: "young people are our future, so it is vital to engage and involve young people in our efforts to improve the local environment." Our plan is to engage with the local schools, to encourage and support young people and their environment ideas and projects.

• Plant a Tree for Jubilee

Next June will be a great opportunity to involve members of the public to remember this special date, as well as encouraging wildlife and improving Crewkerne's green footprint.

Battery-powered horticultural tools

Traditionally, the strimmers and hedge trimmers used by the grounds team have been petrol-powered. These machines are both noisy and environmentally unfriendly. So the Council is moving away from petrolpowered tools and switching to battery power. Our new battery-powered machines are much quieter than the old petrol-powered models and of course far more environmentally friendly.

• Nature Trail at Bincombe



The Council is considering how it could introduce a nature trail at the Bincombe nature reserve. The trail would certainly feature more of the wooden sculptures which have become such a feature of Bincombe, but our ideas also include adding bird and bat nesting boxes and possibly an environmentally sympathetic adventure trail.

If you have other ideas which could improve our local environment and where the Town Council could assist, then please let us know.
