

Badgers at Happy Valley

Readers will remember that the Council spent a considerable amount of (taxpayers) money repairing the damage caused by badgers to the upper level pathway at Happy Valley. Now our four-legged friends have chosen to make a home in the children's sandpit play area, which is why the Council has been forced to temporarily erect safety fencing around part of the play area.

The Council is now working to ensure that badgers are permanently excluded from the play area, with

all work being overseen by Natural England to ensure that we comply with the requirements to protect this species.



Once again, the Council would kindly request that food is not left out for badgers and ensure that dustbin bags are kept out of reach or secured in a wheelie bin.


More information of when this will happen will be announced closer to the time.

Townsend Cemetery Open Day Success

Once again, Crewkerne's Townsend Cemetery opened its doors to the public at its annual open day in September. This year saw a record number of visitors, many keen to trace their descendants who were buried at the cemetery, with the aid of the old burial records, many of which date back to Victorian times.



The Town Clerk used the open day as an opportunity to give a talk, using information from the burial records, highlighting the contrast between today's world and that of our Victorian forefathers, where life expectancy was far shorter than it is today. This presentation was followed by a lively talk and fascinating tour by Tracey Warren, a local funeral director, of some of the notable graves in the old part of the cemetery.
