

#### Millers garage car park

Correspondence as been received from the "SPACE for Crewkerne" group regarding the planned Millers Garage car park which, as Councillors are aware, is an SSDC project. It is understood that this correspondence has also been sent to SSDC and to Highways.

### East Street Car Park, Crewkerne

# Planning Application no: 18/00754/FUL Drawing no: AW/009-27

SPACE for Crewkerne has a primary concern for the safety of pedestrians and cyclist and we feel that there are a number of issues related to this in regard to the above scheme.

The proposal for East Street Car Park started as a stand-alone car park to relieve parking problems in East Street.

Somerset Highways were not happy with an exit onto East Street because of visibility concerns.

South Somerset District Council officers refer to it as a second-best option to a road through to South Street whilst stating it could be changed in the future.

Crewkerne Town Council also had major concerns and SSDC confirmed that dialogue would remain open between District and Town councils.

We are now faced with a scheme in which the sum of the parts adds up to something which tries to please all parties, but is a poor compromise.

The current plan allows for vehicle access from Henhayes, South Street to the East Street car park which will create traffic movement problems through a narrow roadway rather than a simple entrance at East Street and exit at Henhayes, South Street.

Given that some drivers will choose to use the car park as a "rat run", rather than queue in East Street it seems obvious that pedestrians and cyclists will do the same. This means that the car park, and by extension the existing car parks to which it joins, will become very much 'shared space'. We would suggest that a marked pedestrian walkway through the car park, on the same side as the pay machine, should be included, similar to the one already in place linking Lidl to Waitrose. Waitrose car park also has clearly marked routes for pedestrians. As pedestrian and cyclist safety is being prioritised in all Planning and Highways matters we feel this should be expected.

The following points should also be considered:

- Provision for pedestrians crossing at the entrance on East Street
- The extension of the 20mph speed limit on East Street which currently ends at the entrance to the proposed car park.
- Provision of height restriction at the Henhayes, South Street entrance. If two-way traffic is permitted at this entrance large vehicles will be unable to turn in the car park. A height restriction is already shown on the plan for the East Street entrance.
- Electric car charging points which are not shown on the plan.
