Townsend Cemetery Open Day

In addition, Tracey Warren, a local funeral director, will give a talk at 3 pm, on some of the notable graves in the old part of the cemetery and the insight this brings to the social history of the local area and the development of the cemetery in the town.



Henhayes Playground Update

Work has been continuing to improve the playground at Henhayes, with the latest additions being two new picnic benches, kindly donated by the Crewkerne Action for Disabled community group. Looking ahead, the Town Council is planning to establish a new play area in the centre "moat" section of the playground. This exciting play equipment will have lots of play value for both younger and older children, and is specifically designed to be disabled-friendly. The Council is currently working hard to seek out grant funding to support the purchase of the equipment, to minimise the use of Town Council funds.



The Town Council has been investing a considerable amount of time, effort and money into improving the playground. So it is sad and frustrating to report that there has been a spate of vandalism to items in the playground over the summer months. This is your playground, paid for by your Council tax. Bincombe Fayre Success

On Saturday 10 June, the Town Council held a country fayre in and around the Bincombe Beeches nature reserve. This was the first time that the Town Council had held such an event and, despite the hit-and-miss June weather, it was hailed a success by everyone who attended. The fayre was opened by Crewkerne's Town Crier and stalls around the Town Hall offered demonstrations of wood turning and spinning wool, along with some interesting stalls for shopping. A jazz band provided some foot tapping music and, for those who found the walk up to Bincombe a little daunting, the Community Bus was on hand to provide transport.



Up on Bincombe, there was tree climbing on offer, along with a chainsaw artist who created sculptures of woodland creatures from tree stumps. Chris Sperring MBE introduced his Tawny Owl and discussed the habitats that owls need and Paul Burkhardt of Bushwhacker Tours, entertained groups with his knowledge of local plants and their uses.

The next Bincombe Fayre will take place in 2019.

"Beating the Bounds" Walk

Badgers at Happy Valley



If you walk around Happy Valley, you can't have failed to notice that there is lots of evidence of badgers.

Unfortunately, the badgers and their setts are gradually undermining the pathway running up from St Bartholomew's School. The Town Council is keen to ensure that the pathway is properly maintained, but is sensitive to the fact that badgers are a protected species. The Council has therefore taken

advice from Natural England, which is the government's adviser for the natural environment.

At a recent site meeting at Happy Valley, the Natural England representative was able to see for himself the state of the pathway and the evidence of badger activity, and discuss with Council staff options for the way forward. As a result, Natural England has now granted the Town Council a license to undertake remedial work to the pathway, provided that the work is overseen by an ecologist, to ensure that there is no disruption to the badger setts.
