

Minutes of a meeting of the PLANNING AND HIGHWAYS COMMITTEE held at the Council Chamber, Town Hall on Monday 12 December 2022 at 6.45 p.m.

PRESENT:

Cllrs. P. Maxwell (Chair), N. Draycott, K. Head, D. Livesley, J. Morris, J. Nathan, and A. Samuel.

In attendance: Town Clerk K. Sheehan, and seven members of the public.

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting.

OPEN FORUM

A resident presented a petition of 299 signatures opposing the proposed Construction Management Traffic Plan routing site traffic through Hermitage Street, Lyme Road and Lang Road and asking Crewkerne Town Council to write to Highways to support the concerns raised, namely:

- Danger from HGVs to pedestrians using the narrow and inadequate pavements.
- High numbers of children using this as a walk to school route.
- Potential of heavy site vehicles causing further deterioration to the pavements, drainage infrastructure and vibrations impacting structural safety of buildings.
- Associated adverse implications throughout the town centre and beyond, including North Street as site vehicles leave the A303.
- That further detail regarding the other roads designated for site traffic has not been communicated.

Cllr. Maxwell thanked the resident and noted that this would be listed for discussion at the meeting of Planning and Highways Committee on 9 January 2023.

A representative of Action Against Foxhunting (AAF) spoke regarding the planned Boxing Day meet of the Seavington Hunt in Crewkerne, noting that:

- The deadline for the Hunt to apply for a TTRO had now passed.
- AAF had concerns over the safety implications of horses and unleashed hounds on the highway and were liaising with Avon & Somerset Police and Somerset County Highways about this.
- AAF had conducted surveys in the town which had shown the event was not well supported locally.

Cllr. Maxwell noted that Crewkerne Town Council did not condone illegal activity and emphasised that AAF were liaising with the correct organisations as CTC had no remit or powers in highways or law enforcement, and was not involved with the event itself.

- The radar box would return to West Street to monitor speeding vehicles in January, as the data recorded had been impacted by the roadworks in this location.
