CREWKERNE IN BLOOM

Huge congratulations are due to Crewkerne in Bloom, who have surpassed previous years' results to win a Gold Award in the Champion of Champions category of this year's Royal Horticultural Society's South West in Bloom contest.

On top of this, Level 5 'Outstanding' certificates were awarded to Lyewater Allotments & Community green space, Severalls Park War Memorial Gardens and Friends of Crewkerne Station in the 'It's Your Neighbourhood' category, and a Level 4 'Thriving' certificate awarded to the Pill Box near Wadham School.

The CiB team attended a special awards ceremony in Weston Super Mare to collect their certificates, and the flag is proudly flown at the Town Hall.

A special mention goes to Crewkerne in Bloom volunteer John Davies who won a Community Champion Award and the Serco Cup for his superb efforts with Severalls Memorial Gardens. A big thank you to all volunteers involved for keeping Crewkerne blooming!



Welcome Back Funding

Crewkerne Town Council was able to access some funding from South Somerset District Council, to encourage shoppers back to the high street, following the lockdowns and Covid regulations, which are now relaxed. The Town Council is working closely with the business group to help them become a constituted organisation that will support businesses in the town. We are also aiming to produce a small event, each month up to and including March 2022. Look out for the "We are Crewkerne....We Are" brand each month.

The October event ran on Saturday 16th and focused around "We are Crewkerne.....We are Local Producers". We joined forces with the Somerset Farmers Market and Cultivate who are a creative partnership between local food producers and the arts sector. They aim to bring local food, arts and people together. David Reakes from Tor Theatre joined us mid-morning and performed the "Bags v Boxes" poem at various locations around the town and trumpet player Luis Martelo entertained everyone around the Town Hall.

Look out for a short story, commissioned by Cultivate, written by Nick White, about Duncan Palmer from Bower Hinton Farm and the connections with food in our area. This will be available in local shops soon.

November will bring us "We are Crewkerne – We are makers". Keep an eye around the town for more information.

Alice explained, "Just before the lockdown period, I began to lead a dementia awareness group 'The Forget-Me-Nots' at St. Bart's School, as Crewkerne branch are affiliated with the school. We made memory cushions to comfort a dementia buddy from the Memory Group. We managed to fundraise just over £500 for RBL Admiral Nurses. Over the pandemic, we made Easter & VE Day cards and they were delivered to veterans and elderly members of the community, to show that there was someone thinking of them."



Alice was delighted to receive her award, presented at Westminster Abbey, and attended by the Queen and Princess Anne.

Sadness at death of a former Councillor and Mayor

The Town Council paid tribute to former councillor Geoff Clarke, who passed away recently. Geoff was a District Councillor as well as Crewkerne Town Councillor and Mayor from 1994-1998. He was awarded Honoured Citizen in 2012. The Council held a minute's silence before its meeting on 25th October as a mark of respect. Geoff died peacefully at home on Sunday 10 October, aged 84, from pancreatic cancer, after 29 years with Parkinson's. His wife and 3 children were with him.
