As usual, he was proceeded by Merriott Majorettes (who gave a great performance) and the procession was led by the crew and fire engine from Crewkerne Fire station. Santa then retired to his grotto to meet the town's children, who were delighted with the addition of a chimney to the grotto, out of which sweets appeared. Thank you to The Shed, for their creativity with the grotto. Thanks must go to all the volunteers who organised these events and then helped over the two days. Without them, these events would not happen.



Angie and her team of elves organised the installation of 65 small Christmas trees around the town, following the retirement of the chief elf last year. John Wyatt and Hardwills installed the large tree and crib at the front of the Town Hall. Crewkerne in Bloom created the hanging bells and ribbons that hung on all the hanging basket brackets in the town. Market Street had new Christmas lights, which made such a difference. The Christmas market ran at the same time as the Farmers Market on Saturday, which was a great opportunity for shoppers to shop local and pick

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Mayor's Annual Budget Report



Once again it is the time of year when the Town Council sets the budget for the forthcoming financial year. This process takes into account all of the necessary expenditure to maintain services that it provides to the town.

This is always a difficult task for Councillors, not helped this year by rising inflation, and the impact of Covid on its sources of income. The Council works hard every year to ensure that its budget is carefully considered and that all spending is appropriate. The Council manages the available budget across many different areas, including buildings, amenities maintenance, provision of public toilets and grant funding support to local community groups.

This process is now finalised for this year, with the final budget for 2022/23 agreed by the Council. The budget has been set to take account of inflation at £466,525 which represents an increase of £11.65 for the year on a band D property; less than £1 per month.



Community Bluebell Planting at Bincombe

Councillor Alice Samuel invited Crewkerne 1st Scouts and Crewkerne 1st and 2nd Brownie Groups to attend a Bluebell planting event at Bincombe. Groundsmen Jason and Lewis led the session and gave some safety advice.

The bulbs were planted in the Ash Coppice area and the children came up with the name 'Bees, Butterflies and Bluebells' for the name of the small area and a small, rustic plaque will be made to be placed there. The group then spread some bark chippings on the paths.

Following the work, a discussion about Bincombe took place, asking how to enhance the reserve. The children decided that they would like to see more wooden animal sculptures on the trail. The groups also said that they would like to design posters for raising their concerns about dog poo and litter around the town.

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TOWN COUNCIL ELECTIONS 5th MAY 2022



Due to the planned move to a unitary council for Somerset, the Parish and Town elections have been moved forward a year to May 2022. Originally due in May 2023, this means that incoming town councillors will now serve one fiveyear term taking the town to the next scheduled elections in 2027.

On 5th May, electors in Crewkerne will have the opportunity to elect not only twelve town councillors, but two councillors to the new unitary authority.

For 2022/23, the grants awarded total £13,636. The Council was particularly keen to support groups following the Covid-19 pandemic, which continues to impact the fundraising abilities of many. Within this budget, the following grant awards have been agreed for community groups:

The grants application cycle opens in September each year. The councillors spend some time reviewing the applications and make the final decision on awards as part of their budget-setting process finishing in the following January. Cheques are then usually (covid permitting!) presented to each group at the Annual Town Meeting.
