1. Purpose

1.1. To consider revising the wording on the Town Council response to Taylor Wimpey application 23/00006/REM.

2. Background information

2.1. In September 2023, CTC objected to both of the Taylor Wimpey Phase 2 applications due to the impact of dwellings along the cemetery boundary, perceived lack of parking spaces and concerns over the impact on the cemetery boundary trees.

3. Detailed consideration

- 3.1. Taylor Wimpey have explained that this particular application does not include land abutting the cemetery, so this comment is redundant on this application. CTC's wording is retained on the objection to the other REM application, which does include land adjacent to the cemetery.
- 3.2. Regarding the CTC comment on parking, TW have received final comments from Somerset Highways. While the exact conditions are still to be finalised, they have confirmed they have no objection to the scheme which includes the parking quantum.

1. Purpose

1.1. To consider the relocation of the bus stop from Market Square to Market Street.

2. Background information

2.1. As part of their community plan, ABCD put forward a proposal to relocate the bus stop to a location where a bus shelter could be considered.

3. Detailed consideration

3.1 Schedule 2, Article 3, Part 12 of the Town & Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order (England) 2015 (as amended), which states:

Permitted development

A. The erection or construction and the maintenance, improvement or other alteration by or on behalf of a local authority or by or on behalf of an urban development corporation of—

(a) any small ancillary building, works or equipment on land belonging to or maintained by them required for the purposes of any function exercised by them on that land otherwise than as statutory undertakers;

(b) lamp standards, information kiosks, passenger shelters, public shelters and seats, telephone boxes, fire alarms, public drinking fountains, horse troughs, refuse bins or baskets, barriers for the control of people waiting to enter public service vehicles, electric vehicle charging points and any associated infrastructure, and similar structures or works required in connection with the operation of any public service administered by them.

A.2 The reference in Class A to any small ancillary building, works or equipment is a reference to any ancillary building, works or equipment not exceeding 4 metres in height or 200 cubic metres in capacity







Crewkerne Town Council would not need planning permission, as a Town Council, to erect a bus shelter (subject to not exceeding the above limits), providing of course that Somerset Council allow you to install it on their land.

Whilst during a planning application, the Local Planning Authority considers the impact on heritage assets, under permitted development rights no such consideration is afforded. Somerset Council would politely request that consideration is given to preserving the setting of the heritage assets by using a simple design, considering the colours, and not including advertisements on the shelter.

None, it would be funded by developer '106' contributions from Somerset Council.
