### 20 TO NOTE APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllrs. T. Bond and N. Draycott, (both unwell), and Cllr. S Ashton (personal).

### 21 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

23/24

Cllr. Head declared an interest in the agenda item relating to grant applications by virtue of being a member of CUDOS and Crewkerne in Bloom. Cllr. Best declared an interest in the same item due to his membership of CUDOS and the Twinning Association. Cllr. Samuel declared an interest in this item due to being employed at St. Bartholomew's Primary School and Cllr. Nathan also declared an interest in the same item as a member of Crewkerne and District Rotary.

### 22 TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

It was **AGREED** that the Minutes of the meeting of the Policy & Resources Committee held on 9 October 2023 be **APPROVED**.

### 24 **FINANCE**

23/24 a. To receive the third quarter income and expenditure report

The report was noted with no questions asked.

b. To receive a report on the predicted status of Earmarked Reserves as at 31 March 2024

The report was noted. Cllr. Best queried the Reserve for the Victoria Hall lift upgrade and the Town Clerk was asked to investigate if works were up to date. It was noted that the works to the Severalls Pillars had been completed to a very high standard and that this would use up the Pillar Repair Reserve.

### c. To receive a report on the estimated level of General Reserves as at 31 March 2024

Councillors noted the report, which estimated the year end level of General Reserves at 22.4%, which is lower than the minimum level required by the Town Council's policy of 25%. This was due to the cost of the October by-election at £14,000 and the strong likelihood of a second by-election in March.

The grant allocations as outlined above were **AGREED** without change for formal ratification by Full Council.



e. To consider the draft budget and associated precept calculation for 2024/25 and make a formal recommendation to Full Council for approval

Following discussion about the possible need to budget for two by-elections, the following adjustments to the draft budget and precept calculation were made:

- Provision for two summer holiday play days
- Minor upgrades to GRC and Town Hall alarm systems
- Clearance works behind the public toilets at Falkland Square

Cllr. Best noted that the Household Waste & Recycling Centre (HWRC) was on the list of sites proposed for closure and that increasing financial pressures on Somerset Council due principally to social care costs would likely entail further services in towns and parishes would either cease, or significantly change. Cllr. Stuart noted the long list of open spaces, community facilities and venues which were provided by the Town Council.

The amended budget and precept requirement of £639,414 were **AGREED** by all for recommendation to Full Council for formal approval. (Change to a Band D charge of an additional £41.55 p/a, or 79p per week).
