Severalls tennis courts are now ready for booking and playing - you can use the new Clubspark site to do this: https://clubspark.lta.org.uk/SeverallsTennisCourts.

You can either pay for an hourly slot or buy an annual household pass which will allow up to 8 members of the same household to play tennis all year round for £35. Once you have booked your slot, you will receive an access code via email, just turn up at the courts at your allotted time and enter the code into the access gate. Instead of feeling sorry for myself, I threw myself into volunteering, starting at Crewkerne Aqua Centre and fundraising at the Yeovil, Sherborne and District multiple sclerosis group.

Now I have moved on to be Group Coordinator for the MS group, Vice-chair and Treasurer for the Yeovil Town FC DSA (Disabled Supporters Association) and I am now thrilled and honoured to have been elected as a councillor for Crewkerne Town Council.

My interests include watching as much local sport as possible and campaigning so everyone disabled has the same chances as everyone else.

In October they were pleased to attend the awards ceremony where their award was presented by the Chairman of Somerset Council, Cllr. Mike Best.

The citation for the Group reads:

"Severalls Memorial Gardening Group are worthy nominees as they work hard all year round to maintain the town's war memorial gardens. These gardens are a beautiful and peaceful place to sit and enjoy the surroundings. Their continued care and voluntary hard work of keeping the town's memorial grounds so beautifully should be recognised.

The sustainable plants used all around the gardens were either donated or fund raised. They have had two fete events on the green for the community to attend as a thank you for their donations and are hard at work planning their upcoming summer fete.

The group was also instrumental in the campaign to get the ownership of the gardens transferred back to Crewkerne Town Council, helping co-ordinate a petition which was presented to South Somerset District Council. Community Fridge celebrates a year of cutting food waste

On November 30th it will be a year since Crewkerne Community Kitchen started running the Community Fridge at the George Reynolds Centre, , and we are celebrating with a party that day, starting at 9.45. Our Chop and Chat community cooking group will provide light refreshments prepared mostly with surplus food. The group started distributing food that supermarkets cannot sell from Bar5 in July 2020. Food that would otherwise get thrown away has instead been put to good use by people who want to eat it.

The group is run by volunteers, and three in particular have helped make the last year such a success: Kirsteen, Nigel and Vicky are familiar faces to regular visitors who play such a vital role in helping to reduce food waste. We'd all also like to thank Crewkerne Town Council for hosting us at the GRC.

Historic pillar restoration under way

You may have noticed that restoration works have commenced to the pillars at Severalls. These works will stabilise and repoint the two pillars which were originally designed to form some sort of 'triumphal archway' to the estate. Severalls Park was constructed to commemorate the war dead of Crewkerne in the aftermath of the First World War.

At the time of writing the works have started, but are weather dependent so we are unsure of exact timescales.
