Letter from the Mayor

Dear Resident,

2024/25 Precept announcement

It will come as no surprise that escalating costs and pressures have left Somerset Council facing a financial emergency. We have been aware for many months that Somerset Council are actively looking at ways to save money by passing responsibility for some services down to parish and town councils such as Crewkerne. The details on these services are still uncertain but alongside our neighbouring Somerset towns, Crewkerne Town Council has taken the view that it is better to be prepared by making sure we have the staff, tools and money available to keep our town a clean, safe and enjoyable place to live and work in.

With these extra responsibilities in mind, we've taken the difficult decision to increase our part of your council tax bill (we call this the precept) from April. The amount of the Crewkerne precept will depend on the council tax band of your property. For example, someone living in a Band D property will pay 79p more towards the work of Crewkerne Town Council every week—less than a pint of milk. For nearly nine in every ten properties, it will cost this or even less. Remember, only about 9p in every £1 of your total council tax comes to Crewkerne Town Council; the rest of your money goes to funding Somerset Council, the fire and police services, and other agencies. We know from our recent survey that waste services, library services, bin collections, street cleaning, roadside grass and verge cutting are all important to you. Whilst we never like having to increase our part of your bill, we're hopeful we will be able to improve and maintain the high standards our town deserves in addition to continuing to operate all our open spaces, public buildings, sports facilities, support community groups through our grants scheme and deliver events such as the much-loved Lighting Up evening.
