#### 1. Purpose

1.1 To inform councillors about the ongoing Somerset Council consultation on introducing Sunday parking charges in Council-run car parks (including Crewkerne), and to consider the implications and our response; see Appendix A. (somersetcouncil.citizenspace.com)

#### 2. Background information

- 2.1 Somerset Council is consulting on proposals to introduce Sunday parking charges across its car parks county-wide.
- 2.2 The consultation runs from 8 September to 20 October 2025.
- 2.3 At present, Sunday parking is free in many locations including Crewkerne, whereas other locations already have Sunday charges (e.g. Watchet, Minehead, Wells, Glastonbury, Frome, Cheddar and Williton)
- 2.4 The stated aims are to standardise parking charges across Somerset, reduce perceived unfairness of free versus paid Sundays, ensure the parking service remains self-funded (covering staffing, enforcement, maintenance), and support fair usage of parking spaces.
- 2.5 Blue Badge holders would be treated equivalently to current Saturday charges (i.e. if they currently pay on Saturdays, they would pay on Sundays under the proposals).

#### 3. Detailed Consideration

- 3.1 Pros / Arguments in favour
  - Equity and consistency: A uniform policy prevents cross-subsidy whereby drivers in paid areas effectively subsidise those in 'free Sunday' towns.
  - Revenue support: Helps ensure parking services remain financially viable and self-funded, allowing ongoing maintenance, enforcement, and improvements.

- Behavioural impact: May encourage use of alternative transport or reduce unnecessary car movements on Sundays, supporting sustainability goals.
- Local control and engagement: The consultation process allows local input and may enable tailoring of exemptions, discounts or mitigations for certain users or times.

#### 3.2 Cons / Risks / Challenges

- Public resistance / backlash: Residents, businesses or visitors may strongly oppose added costs, particularly for weekend leisure trips or churchgoers.
- Impact on town centre footfall: There is a risk that charging Sundays might deter visitors and reduce spending in local shops, especially on weekend trade.
- Administrative and enforcement burden: Applying, enforcing and managing Sunday charging (e.g. signage changes, staffing) may incur costs or complexity for Somerset Council.
- Equity for vulnerable users: Some users (e.g. low income, disabled) may be disproportionately affected by new charges.
- Impact on Blue Badge / special groups: Even parity with Saturday charges may be seen as unfair in some locations; some may expect free parking for such categories on Sundays.
- Competition from free parking elsewhere: If nearby areas remain free, some drivers may divert to those, reducing local parking revenue or creating displacement issues.

#### 4. Financial implications

- 4.1 As owners of the Henhayes Car Park, Crewkerne Town Council currently receives 50% of the car park income. Therefore, the introduction of Sunday charging could provide a modest increase in revenue to the Council, depending on usage levels.
- 4.2 The net additional income will depend on how many motorists continue to use the car park on Sundays once charges are applied, as well as any associated administrative costs.
- 4.3 There is a risk that reduced usage (if people avoid driving on Sundays) may offset some of the projected revenue.

#### 5. Equalities considerations

- 5.1 The change may disproportionately impact lower-income residents or those reliant on private transport (e.g. in areas with limited public transport).
- 5.2 Blue Badge holders: under the proposals they would be treated same as Saturday charges if they currently pay Saturdays, but equality concerns may arise if this is seen as inequitable.
- 5.3 The council's response should flag potential inequalities and mitigation measures.

5.4 Consider access for religious, cultural, or community activities on Sundays, which are more prevalent for some groups.

#### 6. Crime and Disorder considerations

- 6.1 Implementing Sunday charges may increase enforcement presence on Sundays, which might deter vandalism, misuse or anti-social behaviour in car parks.
- 6.2 Conversely, increased visits or turnover might raise risks of theft, vehicle break-ins or parking disputes.
- 6.3 The enforcement regime needs to be fair and transparent to avoid conflict or disputes.


