


CREWKERNE BANKING HUB





Crewkerne's new Banking Hub officially opened on 8th April and is now operating from the Local Information Centre in the Town Hall, Market Square. This is a temporary location while plans for a permanent site are explored. Run by the trusted team from the Crewkerne Post Office, the Hub offers a much needed return of accessible, face-to-face banking services for the local community. It is open Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm, and serves customers from all major banks and building societies. To mark the opening, Adam Dance MP was welcomed as the Hub's very first customer – a positive and encouraging start to this new community service.

Services available include: paying in cash (notes and coins) and cheques, withdrawing cash (notes and coins), checking your balance, paying utility bills, and access change giving services for registered businesses. In addition, bank representatives are available for one-to-one support throughout the day (excluding their lunch break from 1–2pm). No appointment is necessary.

Bank representatives schedule: Monday-Lloyds, Tuesday-NatWest, Wednesday-Barclays, Thursday- HSBC, Fridays- To be announced.

Crewkerne is fortunate to be selected for this important initiative, especially as many other towns have not been chosen. The success of the Banking Hub depends on community use and support. So whether you need to make a deposit, check your balance, or speak directly with your bank, please do make use of this valuable service and help it grow.

MILITARY GRAVES MILITARY GRAVE POSITIONS

As part of the VE Day 80 commemoration events in Crewkerne, a specially commissioned plaque was unveiled at Townsend Cemetery on 6th May, marking the location of the 19 Commonwealth war graves in the cemetery. A group of Royal British Legion members, veterans and representatives of the Crewkerne and West Crewkerne Joint Burial Committee gathered at the cemetery to watch Royal British Legion member and veteran Terry Austin reveal the plaque. Made by Bill from Crewkerne Shed, this plaque is now on display outside the Cemetery chapels for all to see.

Chair of the Joint Burial Committee, Councillor Mike Best commented, "It seemed very fitting to mark the 80th anniversary of VE Day by commissioning this permanent memorial to the 19 local men who served and lost their lives in both World Wars. Our grateful thanks are extended to Bill from Crewkerne Shed for his careful attention to this detailed and beautiful plaque".

FINGERPOST RESTORATION





We are pleased to share that the refurbishment of the historic fingerpost at the top of Hewish Lane has now been successfully completed. These traditional waymarkers are a distinctive and much-valued feature of our rural landscape, helping to preserve the unique character and charm of our town. Fingerposts are both practical navigation tools and important symbols of Somerset's rich and varied heritage.

> We are proud to share that a new memorial bench has been installed outside the Town Hall, generously donated by the Crewkerne and District Branch of the Royal British Legion. Featuring silhouettes of soldiers, red poppies, and the words "Lest We Forget – We Will Remember Them", this bench is a poignant tribute to all those who have served and sacrificed. The bench it replaces will be carefully refurbished and relocated for use elsewhere in the town.

Crewkerne has commemorated the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day with a series of events that honoured the sacrifices of the past while bringing the community together.

On Thursday 8th May, the Town Crier delivered the official VE Day 80 proclamation outside the Town Hall, joined by Deputy Mayor Cllr. Kathy Head. The proclamation marked the beginning of the national commemoration, paying tribute to those who served and endured during the Second World War.

Later that evening, Mayor Cllr. Alice Samuel led a solemn moment of remembrance at the Severalls War Memorial, where she laid a wreath and lit a Lamp of Peace as a symbol of hope and reconciliation.

The commemorations continued on Saturday with a community event hosted by the Royal British Legion in the War Memorial Gardens. Families enjoyed an afternoon of music, activities, and refreshments, creating a fitting blend of remembrance and celebration.

The Town Council would like to thank all those who took part in marking this significant anniversary, ensuring the legacy of VE Day lives on for future generations.
